NEW WELL UPDATE

Initial water quality testing has been performed on the new Montclair West Well and the results so far indicate that the water meets all state standards with the exception of Iron and Manganese. Additional testing is required as some contaminants require multiple tests at specified intervals as part of their initial testing. In addition, most contaminants have a regular schedule of monitoring for the life of the well. The new well has also been disinfected and sampling indicates an absence of E-Coli and Total Coliform bacteria.

District staff is currently working with WaterBoards to permit the new well and place it into service as soon as possible.

NEW (to us) SERVICE TRUCK



You may soon notice District staff driving around in a blue 1999 Chevrolet truck with a white utility body. This is the District's new service truck that will be used for most of our transportation needs. We still have the big truck for major leak repairs and other large maintenance tasks but the new truck is much better suited for use for most daily tasks.
