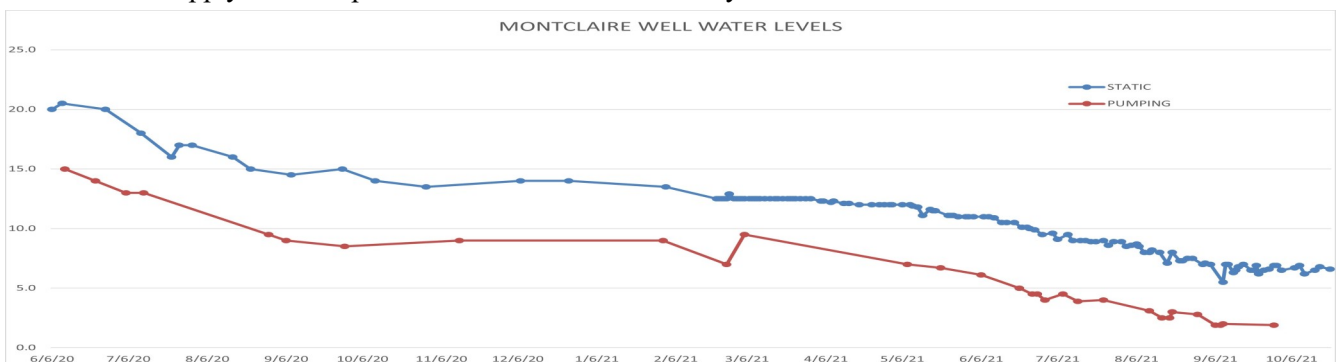

## DROUGHT UPDATE

We finally have had some winter weather and a considerable amount of moisture but please don't get the impression that these storms mean an end to the drought! For the 2021 calendar year, including December's rain and snow, we received slightly more than 8" of precipitation which, while helpful, does not make up for years of drought. Remember the storms in 2019? We received a little over 20" of rain that year, and it seemed like everyone was proclaiming an end to the drought, but the following year we were already talking about water shortages again. While I am still hopeful that we will get more rain before summer, we will need multiple years of above average precipitation to really end the drought and until then we all need to conserve water as best we can to stretch our supply as far as possible. Please use water wisely!
