CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Cora Constructors has begun work preparing the foundations for our new water storage reservoirs at the Montclaire well and tank site and the foundation for the water treatment plant building. To date, the have excavated the tank foundations and compacted base material to support the tank foundations as well as excavating the footings for the building. No additional activity is scheduled until February 18th when Cora's crew is expected to return to complete the foundation work and begin forming and setting reinforcing rod for concrete. Once Cora completes the foundation work at the Montclaire site, they will move to the East Tank site on Tanganda and begin preparing for the east tank foundation



RATE INCREASE REMINDER

Beginning with this invoice you will notice the 10% rate increase as recommended in the 2015 rate study and approved by the Board of Directors. This increase affects both the meter charge (now \$93.96 per month) and the consumption charge (now \$6.04 per unit).
